Students must apply for graduation in Room 552 of the Graduate School. Call 542-4803 for the deadline (this usually falls at the start of the semester prior to the semester in which the student would graduate).

Portfolio Notes:

- You must be registered for at least 3 semester hours in the semester in which you submit your portfolio for examination. You must also be registered for at least 3 semester hours in the semester in which you plan to graduate.
- You must register your intent to present your portfolio by the end of the third week of the semester with the Department Secretary in Aderhold Room 604.
- You must submit your completed portfolio for departmental review no later than the end of the eighth week of the semester.
- Your portfolio presentation may be scheduled to take place no less than two weeks after the completed portfolio has been submitted to your major advisor, and up to the date of the last class of the semester.

Possible Elective Courses

Students should consult with their advisors in selecting their elective courses. The information below is provided to help students make good choices early in their programs.

General Considerations

EDIT 6150 Introduction to Computer-Based Education. Students who have little or no technical expertise with the computer or its educational applications should take EDIT 6150. The content and skills of EDIT 6150 are prerequisite to EDIT 6190, so if you skip EDIT 6150 you will need to provide alternate evidence of proficiency.

EDIT 7460 Internship in Instructional Technology. Most students will complete an internship (usually taken toward the end of the program), unless they already have appropriate experience in instructional technology. Consult with your advisor about whether you should complete an internship.

Non-departmental courses. Students are encouraged to consider courses outside of the department for their electives. In the past, our students have benefited from a wide variety of courses around the university, including: Adult Education, Educational Psychology, Art, Business, Computer Science, and others.

Some Recommended Elective Courses

The electives you take will depend in large part on whether you see yourself working in a school or business/corporate setting upon graduation. Therefore, the following recommendations for elective courses are offered to assist you. These are offered as samples only so, again, consult with your advisor frequently in choosing your actual electives.

Here are some recommended electives for candidates interested in working in K-12 school environments:

- EDIT 6150 Introduction to Computer-Based Education
- EDIT 7500 Technology Enhanced Classrooms (advanced, follow-up to EDIT 6150)
- EDIT 6320 Information Technology (focuses on technology planning)
- EDIT 6360 Information Literacy in the School Media Program (focuses on collaborative planning and facilitating student research)

Here are some recommended electives for candidates interested in working in business/corporate environments:

- EDIT 6180 Instructional Development
- EDIT 7550 Management of Instructional Technology Projects
- EDIT 8350 Instructional Product Evaluation
